What is the Code of Excellence?

The IBEW Code of Excellence (COE) is our union's values-based program that promotes SPARQ (pronounced "spark"), meaning the safest possible workplace, unsurpassed professionalism, shared accountability, a positive working relationship, and the highest quality of work by all.

IBEW members of COE local unions in the utility industry are dedicated to being the safest, most-skilled, and mostprofessional workers in the industry. Our members strive to be the employer's first choice to perform in-house work by:

- Enhancing job safety
- Implementing a culture of professionalism
- Creating a sense of pride in the work they do

Implementing the COE

Adopting the IBEW COE requires total commitment from local union leadership and membership. Implementation of the program also demands a strong steward system and effective communication amongst all the stakeholders (leadership, membership, employer, and management).

Since the COE is an IBEW program, it does not require the employer's participation. However, the IBEW does seek the employer's involvement, as it is a proven way to enhance labor/management relations. A recent, notable example is FP&L; since the COE was adopted by both sides in the past few years, accidents have been cut in half, grievances are down 90%, and the relationship between FP&L and IBEW is as strong as it has ever been.
